**Later from Southern California—The  
Mormons — Stock — Indian Agency—  
Temperance Meeting, &c., &c.**

SAN FRANCISCO, August 16.

The Sea Bird has arrived from the Southern coast. Messrs. Thomas, Jackson and Daley, Elders of the Church of Latter Day Saints from San Bernardino, have visited Los Angeles, and lectured on Mormonism. They have also offered inducements to capitalists to invest in their new city, seventy miles from Los Angeles.

Five thousand head of stock had left for the North.

Mr. Ridley, the old Indian interpreter, has been appointed by Col. Henley Sub-Agent, which gives great satisfaction to the Indians, and also to the

men that are employed there.

A meeting was held this evening in the Baptist Church, Pine street. About one hundred and fifty persons were present, mostly temperance anti-Murray Know Nothings. L. D. Hatch was elected President, and Mr. Wade, Secretary.

Judge Murray was denounced in severe terms as unworthy of his position. The speeches of Revs. Mr. Buchanan and Brierly were spicy and pungent on office-seeking.
