## LATE FROM MEXICO.

We learn from Dr. Wozencroft, that the Convention met at Guerrero on the 4th of October, for the purpose of electing a new President of Mexico. Up to the 12th inst., when the *Cortes* touched at Acapulco, there had been no accounts received of any decisive action by the Convention. It was generally believed, however, that Alvarez would be tendered the Presidency, when he would acknowledge the compliment, and decline accepting the honor. Commonfort, the present acting President of Mexico, it is generally conceded will be finally chosen to permanently fill that position. This is in accordance with the wishes of Alvarez.

THE INDIAN WAR NORTH.—The papers from the northern portion of the State, received last evening, contain but little intelligence in relation to the Indian hostilities in that quarter, except what we have already published. They, however, confirm the former accounts. No later intelligence has been received from Rogue River Valley. By the Shasta papers, we learn that Capt. Jacob Rhodes has organized a company in Yreka for the purpose of taking a part in the warfare which now exists with the Indians. The company consists of twenty-five picked men. On Wednesday last it was to have marched for Rogue River Valley. It is the intention of Capt. Rhodes to scour that region of country.
