Adams & Co.'s Messenger, from Shasta, says thirteen Chinamen and two Americans were murdered by the Pitt River Indians, on McCloud's river, twenty miles east of Pittsburgh. The Americans and Chinese were prospecting, and had staked their arms and camped for the night. The Indians came to them and appeared friendly, but at a signal from their Chief, seized the arms and ran off. The whites and Chinamen pursued, but were beaten. The two whites were killed, and 13 out of 19 Chinamen were slaughtered.

Six Chinese and a party of Americans, at Pittsburgh, started out upon hearing the news, and found the bodies of the thirteen Chinese and one white, all horribly mutilated, arms cut off, heads smashed, &c.

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
