
RAIN.—We were blessed with copious rains on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday last, and, as a consequence, every mining locality in the county is plentifully supplied with water for the time. We learn from our merchants and Expressmen that a greater amount of dust has been in circulation during the ten days last past, than at any previous period during the wet season.

NINE INDIANS KILLED.—We are informed by Mr. Gardner Brooks, that on Friday the 17th inst., a party of nineteen white men started from Mr. Casey's ranch on Clover creek, for the purpose of whipping a number of Indians, who, the day previous, had stolen some stock from Hooper's ranch, on Oak Run. The first rancharie they attacked, contained but one Indian man, whom they killed. They next fell upon the rancharie of the tribe headed by "Whitossa," killing eight men, and seriously wounding five others.
