

INDIAN TROUBLES ON DRY CREEK.—Mr. Benjamin Ritchie, just in from Dry Creek, informs us that a number of animals have recently been stolen from persons on that stream. A party started in pursuit of the stolen property and thieves, and came upon them after they had slaughtered the mules. All the Indians escaped. The savages had other animals in their possession, supposed to be from Clear creek or Trinity river. We regret to learn also, that one of the pursuing party, Mr. John Desmond, lost his life by drowning in the Sacramento river, on the night of the 26th Feb. Mr. D. was a native of Michigan, and about 28 years of age.
