Later From Yreka.

The Expresses of Messrs. Cram, Rogers & Co. and Rhodes & Co., have placed on our table the *Mountain Herald* of the 13th inst.

In regard to the fire the *Herald* publishes nothing additional to that contained in our *extra* of the 13th. Everything was yet in much confusion and it was impossible to give a minute description of affairs.

A party of fifty-six warriors from De Chute's river, on the east side of Cascade Mountains, above the Dalles, a distance of about 400 miles, have arrived in Yreka. They request of the whites the privilege of fighting the Shastas, who killed two parties of their tribe some months since. The whites have promised them their permission, if the Shastas do not give up certain criminals within a given time. These Indians are very well armed, and have in their possession about 200 head of horses. Tye Bill, the Shasta Chief, is encamped near Yreka with a few warriors, and expresses a willingness to exchange a few bullets and arrows.
