From Yreka.

We extract the following items from the *Mountain Herald* of the 12th inst., for which we are indebted to Jack Horsley, of Cram, Rogers & Co.'s Express.

The *Herald* mentions, as a proof that agriculture is a profitable pursuit in that section, that nearly every man who has tried it this year is making preparations to put in large crops next season.

Another difficulty has arisen with the Applegate Indians, which it is probable will lead to open hostilities. It is thought unsafe to travel in that part of the country at present, without keeping a lookout.

Capt. Walker started out of Rogue River Valley on the 8th inst., with a company of volunteers to protect the emigrant trail.

New diggings had been discovered near the top of the Coast mountain, on Ice creek, three miles from the Cold Spring House. Some pieces of gold had been found as heavy as one dollar.

The regular trips of the California and Oregon Stage Company's coaches every other day to and from our place both North and South is adding considerable to the business features of Yreka. We are happy to see that they frequently come in loaded down. We understand that improvements on the roads are progressing.
