☞ Mr. Alfre~~d~~ French, who was killed on the 2nd inst., by the Indians on Mill Creek (a branch of Smith river) about 12 miles from his farm, arrived in California in 1849 or '50. He came from Independence, Jackson county, Mo., where for many years he had been connected with the publishing of the "Independence Chronicle" and, as we learn, enjoyed to a great degree the esteem and confidence of the public. In 1852, he lived in Jackson, O. T., kept tavern for a while, and married as his second Mrs. Noble, who thus early mourns him as his widow; he left no children of his own. Mr. French was about 36 years of age.—*Crescent City Herald*.

Mr. French lived in this place in 1851. During his residence here he was employed as bartender in the Eldorado Hotel, at that time owned by John Clark, Esq. We knew him intimately, having worked by his side for several weeks on the State Printing, in 1852, and it affords us pleasure to state that we always found him an honorable printer.
