## INDIAN WAR DEET.

The Indian War Debt, which amounted on the 27th day of Dec., 1852, to \$924,259 65, has been assumed by the General Government. Since that period to the 20th Dec., 1854, it has increased \$116,280 68—making in all, \$1.030,-530 33. Congress will doubtless make provision for the payment of the entire amount,
