SENATE.

SACRAMENTO, Tuesday, Feb. 27.

Lieut. Gov. Purdy in the chair.

Mr. Mandeville presented a petition from citizens of La Grange, Tuolumne county. Referred to Committee on Counties and County Boundaries.

Mr. McGarry presented a petition from citizens of Napa county relating to hogs running at large. Referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A message was read from the Governor approving of the act for the payment of postage, and of the act authorizing D. N. Darlington and others to construct a wharf at Vallejo.

Also, on the subject of the appropriation of Congress in payment of the California Indian war debt, urging upon the Legislature the necessity of at once sending on the necessary papers and vouchers to establish the validity of the claims, receive, and pay the same over to the State Treasurer. Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs.

Mr. Mandeville introduced a bill for the better observance of the Sabbath. Referred to the Committee on Public Morals.

The Senate then adjourned.
