## ASSEMBLY.

The House met at 10 o'clock. Speaker Stowe in the Chair.

Mr. Burke presented a petition from the citizens of Mariposa, protesting against the formation of Merced county, by dividing Mariposa.

Mr. Palmer introduced a bill to provide for punishing vagrants, vagabonds, and all suspi-

cious persons.

Mr. Foster introduced a bill to protect the owners of growing crops in the mining districts of this State. Referred to a special committee of five. Ordered printed.

An act to provide for winding up the business of the State Marine Hospital; dispose of the property belonging to the same, and to provide for the indigent sick therein.—Oxley.

The Governor communicated to the Assembly letters and documents pertaining to the Indian war in Klamath county. Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs.

Senate bill authorizing the Governor to transmit to Washington a statement of the condition of our Indian war debt. Read twice, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Douglass called up his resolution providing for holding two sessions daily. Laid upon the table.

An act to prevent animals from trespassing on private property, ordered engrossed for a third reading.
