INDIAN DEPREDATIONS ON THE SOUTH FORK.—We understand that the Indians on the South Fork of Trinity River, have recently been very troublesome. A few days since they drove off a pair of horses, valued at \$500, belonging to Mr. David Bush.— They were pursued by a party of ten men from the neighboring ranches, and were overtaken in the mountains while feasting upon the animals they had stolen. Three of the Indians were killed, the rest making their escape.

The friendly Indians say that the animals were stolen by Indians from the Reservation, who had been driven away from the Reservation by the Agent.

PARKER H.
