Town Election.

The election for town officers, on the 24th inst., resulted in the election of the following persons:—

Trustees—J. S. McCain, A. J. Loomis, I. Comstock, R. Clifford, and A. Mitchell; Marshal—C. E. Meredith; Treasurer—H. Hocker; Assessor—F. W. Harris.

The gentlemen only hold their respective offices until the first Monday in May, when the regular annual election will take place.

SAD CASUALTY.—We learn from Mr. Raveley, of Raveley's Express, that on Wednesday, the 28th inst., two men were buried in a drift on Red Galeh, near Stewart's Fork of Trinity River, by the caving in of the earth.
