CRASH.—A part of a brick building fell down on Powell street this evening, about half-past one. LATER FROM CHINA.—The clipper bark Isabelita Hayne, Captain Calhoun, arrived this morning, 47 days from China, she having left the Macao Roads on the 18th of June. The rebels had left the Canton district and proceeded to the Shanghai district, and commenced operations in the northern portion thereof, characterizing their transit by their usual atrocities and depredations. Rice has been very scarce, ranging in price as high as seven dollars per picul. Several vessels were loading for the States, among which were the Young America and Wizard.—*Times and Transcript.*

NINE MEN KILLED BY INDIANS.—We find the following abstract of a letter in the *Herald* dated Yreka, July 30th: "The Indians killed nine men fifteen miles from town, near the mouth of Humbug, on the 28th inst. Your old friend, Mr. Pickins, from Wheeling, (who keeps a ferry across Klamath) escaped unhurt by hiding himself. We have to keep guard until the soldiers arrive. The report is that the Indians have killed nearly all the men on Klamath."
