

**NINE MEN KILLED BY THE INDIANS—
THE KLAMATH WAR.**—The San Francisco *Herald* contains the following, taken from a private letter received in that city :

“ YREKA, July 30, 1855.

The Indians killed nine men, fifteen miles from town, near the mouth of Humbug, on the 28th inst. Mr. Pickins, from Wheeling, who keeps a ferry across the Klamath, escaped unhurt by hiding himself. We have to keep guard until the soldiers arrive. The report is that the Indians have killed nearly all the men on the Klamath. Yours, &c.”
