## Probate Court.

Hon. K. H. Dimmick Judge adjourned on Wednesday of last week to their regular terms in next month.

**COURT OF SESSIONS.**—Hon. W. G. Dryden the recently elected County judge not having received commissions, the regular sessions of this Court will be adjourned over by the Sheriff.

The county officers, with the exception of the county judge will assume the duties of their respective offices on Monday next.

**ASSOCIATE JUSTICES.**—The Justices of the Peace will convene on Monday next, for the purpose of electing two of their number as Associate Justices of the Court of Sessions.

**CARSON VALLEY.**—The county of Carson, Utah Territory, was organized by the proper authorities, on the 2d inst. The U. S. District Court for the 2d Judicial District was organized, Judge Stiles presiding; Orson Hyde Esq., Clerk; L. A. Norton, District Attorney. Orson Hyde has been appointed Judge of Probate, and will, as the boundary is settled more completely, organize the county.

**EARLY WINTER.**—The Indians are predicting an early winter.
