SPECULATION IN FLOUR.—The Sacramento *Tribune* says that considerable excitement exists in Sacramento at present upon the subject of flour speculation, induced by the news received from Valparaiso and Australia, by the steamer Panama. On Wednesday evening the best quality was held at twelve dollars per barrel—though a number of small lots were sold during the day at ten fifty and eleven dollars—but in the afternoon the telegraph announced that at San Francisco eleven dollars was demanded. There seems to be a great scarcity of wheat all over the Pacific coast, and holders in California will be enabled this fall and winter to realize a considerable profit on their present investment.
