Nothings—when he will feel the need of other justification for so shamefully deserting his well tried friends and joining the ranks of his former foes. Arnold once boasted the prend title of "the Hannibal of America." and yet, before he died, he declared to the famous Talkeyrand. "I am the only man in the New World who can raise his hand to God and say—I have not a friend, not one, in all America."

The Benerits of the Telegraph.—The recent emigration of thieves into this county is
doubtless one of the workings of the telegraph
in other portions of the State. San Francisco
and Sacramento are literally within a moment's
time of Placerville, Marysville, Nevada, Auburn
and other important points in the mines, so that
it is impossible, when the wires are set to work,
for thieves to escape in the direction of either
of these places with the fruits of their reseally
industry. Thus feeling their powers too much
contracted, they have abandoned their former
haunts and determined to sojourn awhile where
they would'nt have to contend with lightning.
Hence we have been favored with their presence.

Thus it will be seen that while the telegraph is rendering the lower and central portions of the State considerable service, in driving away thieves, it is doing us an injury by driving them hither. The only remedy that we can suggest is, to follow the example of Downieville, and build a line to this place. By the way, will our friends of the Yreka Union inform us what has become of the company reported to have been organized some months since in that place, for the construction of a telegraph line from Marysville via this town to Yreka?

Nome Lackee Fishery.—This Fishery, established near Tehama, for the benefit of the Indians of the Reservation, is proving quite a profitable enterprise. Rhodes & Whitney's Tehama

agent sends us the annexed statement, from the books of Capt. Young, the Superintendent, of the number of fish, together with their weight, taken in five hauls of the seine, viz:
