Weaverville Items.

We clip the following items from the *Times* of the 24th ult. :

The race on Saturday last, came off over the race course at Sturdevant's Ranch, between Lowe's gray and Bachelder's bay mare, for a purse of \$2,000 a side—distance 400 yards. The race was won by the grey in fine style. A large concourse of eager spectators were present, sundry, numerous and various bets were made, and a large amount of money mysteriously changed hands.

Mr. Joslin of the Express, informs us, that a Spaniard, encamped on Coffee Creek, Friday 16th, had six mules run off by the Indians. A party pursued; came on to their rancherie; one Indian was killed and a white man wounded slightly—all the mules killed.

A man named Sullivan was arrested by Mr. Meredith, for stealing and *filching*, from the pocket of a miner, \$100, while in a state of intoxication. He is *ruminating* at present in a very *confined* apartment in the county jail.

Mr. John Cass, constable, succeeded in tracing the burglars, who broke into Adam's jewelry shop last week, and recovered six of the stolen watches. The offenders were Chinese; two of whom were arrested.
