Latest From Oregon.

The steamer *Columbia* arrived at the Bay from Oregon, on the 5th.

The whole northern military force, both volunteer and regulars, have returned to the Dalles. The volunteers have gone into the field both at the north and the south. They have met detachments of the Indians, and in some instances have driven them and killed a few; in other instances, the Indians have maintained their ground, and have, so far as is known, surpassed our troops in the slaughter of men. They have in almost all cases, had the advantage in the taking of animals, and the supplies and munitions of war. They have destroyed property to a large amount. No general battle has yet taken place.
